COURTESY OF THE FLOOR

Ms. Rachel Legath of 1420 Gail Avenue expressed concerns regarding the group home facility located at 1415 Gail Avenue. She stated that there is a person residing at the facility who has become increasingly destructive and she is concerned for the safety of the children in the neighborhood.

Ms. Krista Makhoul of 1425 Gail Avenue detailed the property damage done by the resident of the group home and requested the Township adopt the Disruptive Conduct Ordinance as quickly as possible.

Chief Soberick stated that he has tried to contact the owner of the home but has been unsuccessful thus far. He noted that the group home has to screen candidates for placement and they should be held accountable for the damage.

Commissioner Brinton inquired if the Township could possibly get rid of the group home. Mr. Nicolo stated that the issue has worked its way through the courts with zoning and it is permitted in that area. He noted that Disruptive Conduct Ordinance will help and suggested including group homes in with language in the ordinance.

Ms. Bonaskiewich commented that she has been in discussions with Chief Soberick regarding the issue and noted that they will bring the Disruptive Conduct Ordinance back to the Board for discussion, but there has to be language that includes facilities such as group homes.

A discussion ensued regarding who governs group homes.
